How to Style Jin Kazama's Hair: Step-by-Step

Follow this professional technique developed with barbers specializing in Asian hair textures like Jin's:

- 1. **Start with the Right Cut:** Ask your barber for a textured crop with 3-4 inches on top and faded sides (clipper grade 2-4). The top should be point cut for maximum texture.
- 2. **Prep Damp Hair:** After washing, towel dry until just damp. Apply a heat protectant if using hot tools like the **Dyson straightener**.
- 3. **Apply Pomade:** Use a dime-sized amount of **Reuzel pink pomade** emulsified between palms. Work through hair from roots to ends.
- 4. **Blow Dry for Volume:** Using a nozzle attachment, direct sections upward while lifting at roots with a round brush. Angle downward to set shape.
- 5. **Create Spikes:** When 80% dry, use fingers to twist and separate sections into spikes. For definition, use a fine-tooth comb.
- 6. **Final Touches:** Apply a light mist of matte hairspray from 12 inches away. For humid conditions, use **hot rollers** for 5 minutes before final styling.

Professional Styling Tips

For Asian Hair Texture

- Use a pre-styler like sea salt spray for extra texture
- Blow dry with medium heat to avoid flattening
- Section hair when applying pomade for even distribution
- Consider a matte finish for more natural spikes

For Caucasian Hair Texture

- Start with texturizing powder at roots
- Use a stronger hold product like Reuzel Pink
