9 1. Essential Haircutting Techniques

- Clipper Cutting
 - Freehand Clipper Cutting: Shape and sculpt without guard guides.
 - **Clipper Over Comb**: Smoothly blend between clipper and longer sections.
 - **Fading**: Blend hair from longer to shorter lengths (low, mid, high, burst fades).
 - **Tapering**: Gradual hair reduction around the neckline and sideburns.
- Shear Cutting
 - Blunt Cutting: Clean, sharp edges (great for straight bobs & men's trims).
 - **Point Cutting**: Softens blunt lines and removes weight.
 - Slide Cutting: Shear slides along the hair for texture and shape.
 - **Texturizing**: Removes bulk; creates softness and flow.
- Razor Cutting
 - Straight Razor: Create ultra-clean hairlines and detailed shapes.
 - Feather Razor: Used for soft, feathered ends and layered textures.

🜋 2. Beard and Facial Hair Techniques

Beard Sculpting

- Shape and contour using trimmers and scissors.
- Taper beard into haircut for a seamless look.

Line-Ups / Edge-Ups

- Define natural hairlines with precision trimmers or straight razors.
- Focus on forehead, temples, and sideburn areas.

• Hot Towel Shave

- Steam softens skin and hair for smoother shave.
- Use shaving cream and a straight razor at a 30° angle.

3. Blending & Fading Mastery

Fade Type	Description
Low Fade	Subtle fade starting just above the ear
Mid Fade	Versatile fade from temples down
High Fade	Starts high on the head for dramatic contrast
Burst Fade	Circular fade around ears
Skin/Bald Fade	Tapers hair completely to the skin
Shadow Fade	Soft, blurry transition between lengths

Pro Tip: Always use a flicking-out motion with clippers for seamless blends.

🧼 4. Hair Styling Techniques

- **Pompadour**: Comb hair backward with volume; hold with pomade.
- Side Part: Create a clean, defined parting line.
- **Quiff**: Voluminous front styled backward and upward.

- **Textured Crop**: Messy yet controlled top with short sides.
- **Slick Back**: Comb all hair back using strong-hold gel or pomade.

Product Use

- Pomade High shine & firm hold
- Wax Medium hold & matte finish
- Clay Strong hold & natural texture
- Gel Very strong hold, wet look
- Mousse Volume and light hold

- Suggest realistic cuts that match client preferences.
- Offer aftercare advice to maintain style between visits.

🚫 7. Common Mistakes to Avoid

- Cutting hair when overly wet = uneven length.
- Over-tapering = harsh lines & unnatural shapes.
- Rushing fades = poor blending.
- Neglecting sanitation = client trust issues.

- Disinfect tools between clients.
- Wash hands thoroughly.
- Use clean capes and neck strips.
- Store razors in approved containers.
